Dear Families,

It was wonderful to see so many families visiting our school last Tuesday evening to meet with our educators as a part of our **Acquaintance Night**. Absences and Communication

Any child who is not in their classroom at 8.45am is considered late and must present to the front office to sign in and collect a yellow late slip to give to their teacher. If your child needs to leave school early, parents/caregivers are asked to come into the front office to sign their child out. We will call the class for your child to meet you at the office.

The number to text for student absences is 0476 857 224. Please text this number by 9am if your child will be late or absent from school and include a reason for their absence. The marking of attendance is a legal document. All absences, be they 2 minutes late or two days, are marked as unexplained unless parents provide the school with an explanation (via telephone, text or written note). A text message will be sent to parents/guardians if a child is late or absent without an explanation.

Should you need to get a message to your child during the day, all communication must be made through the front office by calling 8296 8904. We will attempt to contact the class teacher to pass on **urgent** messages only. Parents are kindly asked to make personal arrangements before school as much as possible to limit the disruption to classes. Please note, the absence text message line should not be used for other purposes. Any general communication to your class teacher should be done via Seesaw or email.

We also ask that if you need to drop anything off during the day (forgotten lunches, homework etc), please do not go to the classroom, rather drop it to the office and we will get your child to collect it.

Welcome to all new families at Paringa Park and welcome back to the old ones!

I thought it would be good to introduce myself and tell you about my role. I am the school's Pastoral Care Worker. I have a Bachelor of Education and over 15 years experience as a teacher. I have been here at Paringa for 2 years.

There are six dimensions to my role and they are:

- Social and Emotional Support
- School Engagement
- Community Engagement
- Extra-Curricular Contribution
- Spiritual Support
- Mentoring and Role Modelling

In practice at Paringa Park Primary I spend my days helping out in classrooms, running small groups for children (predominantly social skills or emotional wellbeing), working individually with children and meeting with parents to offer support. In term 3 I run Paringa's Got Talent, our annual talent show. What amazing talent there is at this school! I also like to check in with the lovely staff here and encourage them in their roles.

We are fortunate to have the support of Reverend Barb from St Philip's Anglican Church, Brighton. Barb is on the Governing Council and actively supports the Paringa Park community.

As parents and families I am also here to support you. I believe it is important for school and home to work together. This means that if you have any concerns, either at home or at school I would be happy to be of assistance if I can. It might involve referring you to other resources, listening over a cuppa or following through some of your ideas to support your child.
