

Principal's Welcome

Dear Families,

We value our families as a child's first teacher and are continually looking for ways to develop strong partnerships with parents to help our learners feel connected and supported in their learning.

In November last year our Chief Executive Martin Westwell and his team asked our children and young people to kick off discussions about what the purpose of public education in South Australia should be. They asked how we could ensure we were adapting to stay ahead of changing demands, and support children and young people to learn and thrive as they prepare for their futures beyond the classroom.



Martin and his team then involved the broader community in the discussion. After collating and summarising the thousands of ideas from children and young people, staff, families, community members, international experts and others, our new purpose and strategy was released. Student agency

What is student agency? Why is it important? Student agency builds the critical thinking and problem solving skills students need to thrive. It is really important because students who actively engage in their education build a deeper understanding of content.

Over the last couple of weeks, I have had two groups of students organise an appointment with me to discuss issues that are very important to them. One issue involves our LA 2 toilets. The Year 4 girls wrote a persuasive letter that was extremely convincing as to why we need to have a bathroom revamp. I invited the girls to present to the leadership team last week and our two business managers this week. Our next step is to form a plan of action to renovate the toilets but to also remind students about using them appropriately.



The second group of students came to me about an issue that was concerning rubbish around the school, particularly behind the wooden seats in our nature play area. We have organised another meeting next Monday with the SEAT (student environment action team) to formulate a sustainable plan to tackle our pollution issue.

Hats

Just a reminder as we are now in term 3 and our <u>Sun Protection and Hot Weather Policy and Procedure</u> comes into effect where all students are required to wear a hat during play time and outdoor activities.

'During terms 1, 3 and 4 and whenever the UV radiation levels reach 3 or above, all children are required to wear hats that protect their face, neck and ears e.g. legionnaire, broad brimmed or bucket hats, whenever they are outside. Baseball or peak caps are not acceptable.'
