Managing class placement worries

Moving up to a new class can be a stressful time for some students and families. As a staff we recognise this and do our very best to ensure placements work the best. We take into consideration academics, special needs, social selection (students name 4 friends) and parent considerations. We use teacher knowledge and judgement and previous years metrics to place students using a computer system that we feed information into. Teachers then spend a number of weeks working through the class lists.



This must then fit into the class numbers we have for each year level and work around the class sizes so each class is not overloaded, and we have room to take other in zone students during the year. It is for these reasons that students are not shifted after moving up day.

It is a complex process, but I can say it is done with great care and great passion by our staff as they work within the boundaries that are set. It would then be fair to say your child may have come home unhappy that they are not with a friend that they wanted. We make it very clear early on to students that we can only guarantee they will have at least 1 of their nominated friends in their class.

At this point it is vital for you to have a chat with your child about who is in their class, not who is not or what they do not have. Our values of challenge and trust come into play at this point. Acknowledging that yes this is a challenge for them is important, recognising their emotions is important, but what defines how your child will react and behave will be if you discuss with them the positives about being in this class in 2024. Talk to them about the opportunities that are there and the trust and faith the teacher from 2023 has seen in them to be in a class to develop new friendships and grow their network.

Allowing your child to feel sad is okay, it is one of 5 primal emotions that we are built with, but framing it as a challenge that they can get through and will be better off for having tackled is crucial and an incredible life skill that you are passing on to them. Having a period of sadness is okay, but they need to move on from this and by speaking about their placement as a challenge that has lots of support (parents, teachers, leaders and new friends they don't even know yet) can be an uplifting experience for them going forward.

Children are remarkable humans and are so incredibly flexible and resilient when given the chance. As parents we sometimes jump in and don't allow them the chance to think and feel and reflect with our help – I am as guilty as anyone on this. What I have learnt is to take a step back, be a guide, listen and model strategies when they are calm and collected.

Out of School Sports News

Thank you to our sports coordinators this year. They have worked really hard to deliver some fabulous experiences for our students in all the sports that PPPS has to offer. In the coming days we will release a registration form for Summer (term 1 and 4) sports via a new online form.
