## Maths

All classes have continued with investigating the 6 aspects of place value or working on pre-place value understandings. The latest aspects covered have been 'compare/order' and 'rename'.

## Compare/Order

"Understanding where numbers 'fit' in relation to each other is another important aspect in coming to fully understand place value. While ordering numbers is a necessary skill to teach our students, when we consider the 'big picture' of place value, placing numbers in order is a relatively superficial skill. However if students are asked to accurately place numbers on a numberline, they would find this much more challenging. This is because placing numbers on a number line requires a deep sense of the value and magnitude of numbers. (Rogers, 2014)."

Some of the indicators of success for this aspect are:

- Compare numbers to determine which is larger or smaller
- Compare numbers in a multiplicative manner. e.g. ten times larger
- Locate numbers on empty, partially marked or complete number lines.


## Rename

The Australian Curriculum defines renaming as: "To express a number according to the relationship between the place value powers of 10 , e.g. 263 can be renamed 2 hundreds and 63 ones or 1 hundred, 16 tens and 3 ones."

Dr Ange Rogers states, "of all six aspects of place value, 'rename' can be considered the most important (and most challenging) for students to understand (Rogers, 2014)."

Misconceptions are common for this aspect. Three-digit renaming is more challenging for students.
Further examples of renaming could also be:

- Standard way: 53 can be 53 ones or 5 tens and 3 ones
- Non-standard way: 53 can be 4 tens and 13 ones or 3 tens and 23 ones

Dr Ange Rogers suggests we explain to children there are everyday examples where bigger units are made up of smaller units. For example:

- AFL scoring - what large and small units are used? (1 goal is made up of 6 points)
- One dozen eggs (1 dozen is made up of 12 individual eggs)
- Time (1 hours is made up 60 minutes)
- Money ( $\$ 1$ is made up of 100 cents)
- Length (1 metre is made up of 100 cm )

Can you think of any others as a family?

## SAPSASA Mountain Biking

Recently we had an issue with some of our students building bike jumps in the yard to use after school. Unfortunately, we have had to demolish these jumps as they are unsafe. We also don't want to promote the school as a bike park when there are other appropriate areas within our community for children to ride. However, after speaking with the students they informed me that the local places are dangerous, and they have had poor experiences with being harassed at these sites by older students.

As a way of continuing this really healthy passion of bike riding, I will be taking a team of students to the Sturt Gorge Track as part of a Mountain Biking SA SAPSASA sport event being held on 10 May. There are categories for boys and girls in year 5 and 6 . At this stage we have 6 interested teams of 4 students. I will be sending home a form via Edsmart to those families. There is a cost of $\$ 12$ per student. I would love some parent helpers on the day to supervise and help marshall the course. Please indicate if you can help on the forms when they come out in the next fortnight.

I am also getting in contact with the council to see what support can be provided.
